To our Guests...

Sky Ranch is an outdoor ministry of congregations affiliated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We hope to expand Christian community and friendship through Christ centered celebration and service.

We welcome campground guests from many churches and organizations and invite you to learn more about our programs which are open to all.

Because we are a licensed residential youth camp, we have developed a few regulations that we ask you to follow. They are listed on the back of this registration form.

In case of emergency, you will hear a siren and a Sky Ranch staff member will come to the campground to give you instructions. You will also be alerted to weather conditions that may affect your stay at Sky Ranch.

Basic Campground Rules

***Rules subject to change based on current Covid-19 protocols.

- 1. All guests must register prior to setting up their unit in an assigned site.
- 2. Fires are allowed only in approved metal fire pits and only when allowed by Sky Ranch which follows USFS and county regulations.
- 3. Pets must be kept on leash and kept from barking or disturbing other guests.
- 4. No ATV's or motorized dirt bikes or off road vehicles are allowed at Sky Ranch.
- 5. No horses are allowed at Sky Ranch.
- 6. Please observe quiet times beginning at 10 PM to 7 AM.
- Smoking is a fire hazard at Sky Ranch. If you must smoke, stay by your fire ring and smoke on the gravel surface. Smoking may not be allowed during fire bans.
- 8. Do not carry picnic tables from other sites to your site. Groups must receive permission to move tables.
- Fishing licenses are required in accordance with Colorado law (they can be obtained online—ask for assistance at Christ Lodge)
- 10. Those with self contained units, please, no wastewater dumping.

Use of Facilities

So you're interested in checking out the facilities of Sky Ranch? Be cautious. Camp buildings are often being used by other groups. You are only allowed to explore the public spaces which include the main dining floor of Christ Lodge, the campground bath house (see map) and the meeting area of the Backpack Center. To see other buildings you will need a Sky Ranch guide who knows which facilities are in use, including the lodge areas which are often home to staff members or retreat guests. Just ask and we'll be happy to show you around.

If you need help

Ask our staff. We have trained responders at Sky Ranch and often have an R.N. We have maps to show you how to get to emergency facilities in Ft. Collins. Look for us in Christ Lodge.

Helpful Information

Hiking

That's probably what you're here for. For your safety, we invite you to sign out at our office in Christ Lodge with your destination and expected return time. We have lots of maps and information about difficulty of trails surrounding Sky Ranch. And you can sign out there, too. That way, if you don't come back, we have an idea where you went! Take water, take food, take more water and plan your clothing carefully.

Wildlife

There's lots around. You'll likely see a moose or two because we are smack dab in the middle of prime habitat. But stay clear! A picture from a distance is much better than trying to get close to these feisty characters. Be alert when fishing Beaver Creek in the willows—you're stepping inside their home. We haven't had bear problems recently but it's best to keep a tidy campsite.

Fun things to do

Every Friday and Saturday night we have a campfire at one of our circles (or in the backpack center if it's raining too hard). We also offer worship each Sunday morning at 10:30 am in the outdoor chapel located in your campground. We often have special programs going on throughout the summer—wildflower hikes, weaving classes, carving walking sticks, and much more. Many of these "mountain schools" have additional fees. If interested, ask at the Lodge for a brochure.

Meals

Most campground guests like to bring their own food and do their own cooking, but you can order meals in advance or you can check during the day to see if it's possible to sign up for meals. Because we are so far from the store, we have to plan ahead.

Garbage

Garbage cans are located in the tent areas of the campground. Garbage is removed each night. Please make sure to dispose appropriately. Sky Ranch does recycle! Please keep separate from trash.
